



What Will My Child Learn?

## TUESDAY

### *Infant Activity*

Roar! Did you know that babies are able to make the sounds of animals before they are able to speak words? Practicing roars, meows, quacks and more are a great way to engage in early verbal language. Play with animal toys and make the animal sounds with your baby.

### *Toddler Activity*

What are your teeth used for? Dinosaurs have different teeth for eating different kinds of food. Use a mirror and maybe a flashlight or magnifying glass if you have them, and encourage your toddler to examine their teeth. Are they sharp and pointy? Are they flat and strong? What kinds of food can your teeth chew? Are their things that your teeth should NOT chew? How do we keep our teeth clean? (Your child might want to compare their teeth to yours! Just make sure you discuss not putting hands in other people's mouths)

### *Preschool Activity*

How big were dinosaurs? A Stegasaurus could be 12 feet tall and 30 feet long. A piece of paper is typically 11 inches long (close enough to a foot for these purposes, but feel free to use another material that you can ensure is a full 12 inches!) . Cut some paper into thirty 11-inch long strips. Support your child in lining up the strips and taping them together, counting as you go. Admire how gigantic a stegosaurus was. Next, use the same size strips and have your child lay on the floor. measure their height in strips and compare to the stegosaurus.
